Statistics are not just numbers. They tell us the story of lives impacted by domestic and sexual violence.

In every year that records have been kept, South Carolina ranks in the top ten states in the nation in the rate of women killed by men. Our state's female homicide victimization rate has often been double the national average.

Firearms, particularly handguns are the weapons of choice. Over 60% of these victims were killed with guns. The presence of a firearm in a domestic violence incident increases the risk of the woman being killed by 500%.

In 2017, over **9,167 direct** and **secondary** victims accessed services at one of **15 Rape Crisis Centers** in South Carolina. (*DHEC*)

There were **20,088 crisis hotline calls** made to domestic violence organizations in FY 2016-17. These **13 organizations** provided emergency shelter to **5,493 adults** and **children** fleeing violence in their homes.
